# Winter Tips

Winter is just around the corner. Please be mindful of the weather when you send your child to school. Be sure to check the forecast each day as the temperature can vary greatly from day to day. Layering outwear is a great way to deal with temperature changes.

When it is very cold, students should wear warm coats with hats and gloves. In general, students go out for recess when the wind chill is 20 degrees or above (provided there



aren't large amounts of snow.) If students wear boots to school, please be sure they bring shoes to change into. This is especially important on days when they have physical education.



# Reminders

--All book bags, backpacks, and bags (including purses) need to remain in cubbies and lockers throughout the day. If a student needs something from their bag, they can ask for permission from

their teacher to go to their cubby or locker to access it.

### **Attendance Policy**



Every student. Every day.

Attendance is highly important to the success of every student. However, BES recognizes the difficulty of attendance during the pandemic.

The following article outlines how parents/guardians should address absences when a student is away from school.

#### 1. Illness

Students should stay home if they are not feeling well or are ill. It can be hard to determine if a student should attend school. In the time of the pandemic, if your child is not feeling well, keep your child home and seek medical attention if appropriate. When the students returns to school, send a parental note explaining the absence or a medical excuse if medical attention was sought.

#### 2. Appointments

It is highly encouraged to schedule appointments at a time that is not during school hours. If it is unavoidable, a parental note or a medical excuse should be submitted.

#### 3. Tardies or Leaving Early

When a student is tardy or needs to leave school early, a parental note should be submitted upon the student's return. Tardies and leaving early count as occurrences of absence.

#### 4. Other Absences

For all other absences, a parental note should be sent upon the student's return. Parents may write excuse notes for up to 10 occurrences of absence.

#### **Quick Tips:**

In general, absences are either medically excused, parentally excused, or unexcused.

--When a student has received medical attention and a medical excuse is received in the office, these absences do not count in the total number of absences per year.

--When a parent writes off an absence, it is excused but still counts in the total number of absences per year. This includes when a student is ill but no medical attention was sought.

--When a student is absent but no excuse is received, the absence is unexcused.

--Parents may write off 10 occurrences of absence per year. An occurrence includes full or partial absences, tardies, and leaving school early or arriving late. After 10 parental excuses, all subsequent absences need to be accompanied by medical documentation, otherwise the absences are unexcused.
